VISIONS OF VISION PROJECT LAUNCHED

On March 14, 2013, an agreement was signed by Christians Encouraging Christians, Inc., Mustang Optical, Mustang Kiwanis and Dr. Thomas Wolf, Ophthalmologist, to form a strategic alliance for the purpose of helping to alleviate the problem of obtaining eye care for those who are experiencing financial difficulties.

Dr. Thomas Wolf, MD, an ophthalmologist who services the greater Oklahoma City area, has agreed to perform two eye exams per week free of charge for our Visions of Vision project.

The Mustang Kiwanis organization has agreed to furnish funds to supply eyewear for students in the Mustang, Oklahoma, school system who are recommended by teachers or counselors.


To help further meet the objectives of the “Visions of Vision” project, Caddo Electric Cooperative Operation Roundup Program awarded a \$2,000 grant to Christians Encouraging Christians, Inc. This grant money will help us with the expenses of the adults who are in need of eye care.

Mustang Optical will measure, make and fit the eyewear at a substantially reduced price so that our funds will benefit the most people.

Kathryn Spradley, President of Christians Encouraging Christians, Inc., is the coordinator for the “Visions of Vision” project. She says that this project has been made possible by the generous donation of 850 pairs of eyewear from an anonymous out-of-state optician. The Mustang newspaper ran an article about the Strategic Alliance being signed, and we have had

many calls for information about our project. We have now established the process for coordinating this effort and have begun meeting the eyewear needs of the recipients.

The scope of this project is not limited to Mustang, Oklahoma, so if you know of someone who is in need of eyewear and does not have the financial means to obtain it, please contact Kathryn at (405) 204-4570, to make arrangements to start the process for an eye exam and the appropriate eyewear at no cost to the recipient.

SHIPS 1,300 LBS OF CLOTHING
TO HONDURAS

A group of committed volunteers spent numerous hours sorting and packing clothing, and sealing and labeling boxes so that we could meet the shipping company's deadline of March 22, 2013. There were over 1,300 pounds of clothing packed into thirteen large boxes and shipped to Tegucigalpa, Honduras, for distribution to Christians in the surrounding area.



ENCOURAGEMENT 101: CHILDREN

In our last newsletter we answered the question “How do you know what to do to encourage someone?” by listing things we can do to encourage seniors. In this newsletter we want to direct our attention to the children in our lives. We formed a focus group and did a brainstorming session, which resulted in the following interesting list of ideas to encourage children.

ENCOURAGEMENT FOR CHILDREN

- Treat them with honor and respect
- Acknowledge their importance in your life
- Expect the best from them
- Apologize and ask forgiveness when you have done something to hurt them
- Listen to their concerns, joys, sorrows, etc. and ask questions to stimulate conversation
- When you discipline, do it with love and the proper spirit
- Validate their hurts and pains
- Teach them to be grateful
- Teach them to respect authority
- Teach and practice effective communication
- Help them memorize the books of the Bible
- Spend time with them
- Encourage their questions
- Read the Bible to them every day
- Pray with them every day
- Keep your children in mind when making career choices
- Work towards having a harmonious home
- Display scripture sayings in home
- Help them memorize Bible verses
- Read to them
- Tell them a story about Christ
- Remind them of God’s love for them
- Find a way to teach them a moral value
- Teach them scripture songs
- Tell them Bible stories
- Teach by example to love the Lord’s church
- Play a game that teaches good values/ character
- Tell them how God loves them and wants what’s best for them

- Practice patience with their mistakes and help them learn from mistakes made
- Let them hear you praise and find the good/ positive in your spouse and other Christians
- Talk about heaven to them
- Remember special days
- Share a compliment that you have heard about him/ her
- Set aside a whole morning/ afternoon/ day just for spending time with them
- Look for the good in them and compliment them when you find it
- Help them find wholesome/ fun activities to do with family/ friends
- Help them select and maintain friends that have good values

Remember these ideas came from a brainstorming session and are in no particular sequence. These are ideas that you might possibly use to encourage the children you come in contact with on a daily basis. We pray we all practice I Thessalonians 5:11 with every child we know.
